
3 Tasks that we are focusing on for July 1

- Transparent budgeting formula to be developed with the Child Support Advisory Council.


COUNTY ATTORNEY CONTRACTS

- Will be developed and negotiated with OAG General Counsel.
- Will allow for payback terms on advanced funds to be more flexible than this past year.

COUNTY ATTORNEY COLLABORATIVE COUNCIL

CACC

- Created by Attorney General Executive Order
- Comprised of 10 County Attorneys or their designees with encouragement to include case specialists
- Chaired by Office of Child Support Services' Chief as the Attorney General's designee.
- Propose awareness initiatives
- Guide training of staff and stakeholders
- Input and collaboration on budgeting, publications, policies and legislative initiatives.
- Creation of working groups to focus on specific issues.
- Endless possibilities to inform the future of the Office of Child Support Services
